The 2012-2013 school year will be a great year! Union Hill I.S.D. has received a Superior Achievement rating since the beginning of the Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (F.I.R.S.T.) in 2002. The district not only received a Superior rating, but scored a perfect score of 70 out of 70.

U.H.I.S.D. has adopted a resolution to replace the high stakes testing accountability system with a system that engages student learning, cultivates individual talents, and restores local control over student achievement.

Also, U.H.I.S.D., along with approximately 400 other school districts in Texas, has joined the Texas Tax-

payers and Student fairness Coalition et al. v. Robert Scott, et al. Litigation. Hopefully, this will restore the funding cuts of \$5.4 billion from the 82nd legislature session and create an adequate and equitable formula based funding system.

Even though the accountability standards have increased (STAAR, End of Course Exams and AYP), Union Hill I.S.D. believes in excellence for all, a high focus on academic achievement, and providing a quality education, which serves all students.

I would like to personally thank the Board of Education, Administration, faculty/Staff, students, parents and community members for working together as a TEAM. Students in U.H.I.S.D., along with the 4.7 million other students in the state deserve the best educational opportunities in the nation.

ALUMNI CORNER featuring Laura Crone and A Family Tradition

Mrs. Laura Crone attended first grade at Union Hill before moving to Bridgeport, Texas, in 1956. She moved back to East Texas from Oregon in 1981 and started substituting that same year for Ms. Ruth Drew who was teaching here when Mrs. Crone left in 1956. Ms. Drew retired in 1982 and Mrs. Crone was hired to take her place teaching business.

The teaching assignments for Mrs. Crone included accounting, typing, business law, recordkeeping, business English, BASIC computer language, computer literacy, business communication information systems, desktop publishing, multimedia, and year-book production.

Extracurricular assignments included NHS sponsor, Student Council sponsor, senior class sponsor, cheerleader sponsor, and Interact Club sponsor.

From 1982 until 1990, Mrs. Crone was coach of junior high and high school girls' basketball and track.

The last assignment which Mrs. Crone still performs is bus driver. She still drives the same route today. After more than 27 years of teaching at Union Hill, Mrs. Laura Crone retired from teaching in 2008. However, she still returns to various assignments at Union Hill such as substituting and administering tests.

Many family members are alumni and have been actively involved in Union Hill I.S.D. down through the years.



Aron Tucker, father of Laura Crone, graduated from Union Hill in 1933. He was a member of Union Hill Bulldogs basketball team. Mr. Tucker drove a school bus his senior year earning \$10.00 a month.

Doyle Tucker, uncle of Laura Crone, graduated salutatorian in 1940. He was also the first quarterback of Union Hill Bulldogs football team.

Duane Tucker, uncle of Laura Crone, graduated in 1946. He was a member of the Bulldogs football team all through high school.

Donald Tucker, another uncle, graduated in 1948. He also played football and basketball all through high school.

Bobby Tucker, brother of Laura Crone, graduated in 1954. He was a member of Union Hill Bulldogs football and basketball teams all through high school.

Robert Blundell, uncle of Laura Crone, served on Union Hill School Board during the 50's, 60's, and 70's.
